If your child was born between September 1st 2019 and August 31st 2020, and you would like to be considered for a place in our in our Nursery starting September 2023, please complete our Supplementary Information Form. All children are entitled to government funding from the start of the school year following their 3rd birthday. Depending on parent eligibility, this will be either 15 or 30 hours per week for 38 weeks of the year.
