What's been happening in Owls and Foxes classes...

In maths we have been learning about sequencing numbers, more and less and have learnt to name a number that is 1 less and sometimes even 2 less. Next week we'll be learning to divide an amount into 2 groups and how to add groups together.

This is a good game to help children remember the numbers that add together to make 10.

In phonics we are continuing to learn the phase 3 digraph sounds (2 letters that make 1 sound) and how to read and spell with them. This week we have learnt sh, th, ng and next week we will look at ai, ee, igh oa.. The phonics bloom website also has some useful games on it. We would recommend using the phase 2 games as practice, until we have taught the phase 3 sounds at school.



We have compared different environments in our world, looking closely at the South Pole and Tanzania in Africa. We used the words environment, habitat and climate to describe them. We have made books and art inspired by African animals and have explored ice freezing and melting.

In RE we have been learning the story of the Loaves and the Fishes. We tried to share a little bread between us as we can't perform miracles like Jesus. We then found lots more bread in the basket, which we buttered and shared on the snack table! We made some beautiful fish, but I'm not sure there were enough for 5000 people1 We have continued to sing the song 'Jesus loves me
