


Congratulations Grace and Thank You!!!

Preparing Your Child For KS2 SAT's Week ~ Monday 13th May to Thursday 16th May 2024

Year 6 children can come and settle into class early on these days.

Classes will be open for Y6 children from 8:30am.

SATs Tip 1: Keep calm and carry on – It's only the SATs

SATs Tip 2: Get the correct test dates in your calendar early

The Year 6 SATs take place over the course of 1 week, so to avoid confusion in the mornings we recommend writing each of the dates of the tests in your calendar so you know what is coming up and when!



<u>SATs Tip 3</u>: Put aside ten minutes each evening to discuss how their day was A ten minute conversation about what they learned that day, and how they are feeling about it is a great way to find out if your child is struggling or needs any help with their work.



SATs Tip 4: For SATs week itself, swap the Rice Krispies for something more substantial A good breakfast before a day of tests can be the difference between a child thinking about what's coming for lunch and about the answer to the questions in the test.

Make sure your child has a hearty breakfast before they begin their day and this won't be an issue.

SATs Tip 5: Put a stop to the morning rush

Set your alarm 10 minutes earlier to make sure you're ready on the day of the tests. You can also make sure that lunch is prepared and bags are packed the evening before the tests to ensure that your family can be up and out of the door with plenty of time to spare. By arriving early, it gives your child time to relax and prepare for the coming day, and this is much better than rushing through the gates at 8.44am for an 8.45am start!



NO MOW MAY

Last year, our school Eco Warriors wanted to take part in #NoMayMay and we're doing it again this year!

We are trying to help save our planet and prevent climate change and you might be able to help too.

No Mow May is a national campaign to encourage people not to mow their lawns until the end of May in order to boost the flowers and nectar available to pollinating insects such as bees, butterflies and moths.

Our school will not be cutting the grass on either side of the slope at the front of the school, so please don't think we're being lazy!

Create your own amazing animal using as many ideas as you want. You can draw, paint or sculpt your fantastic beast, using any media that you wish.



With Grace's efforts from her 5K run, we have boosted our total.



Preventing Online Radicalisation and Extremism

Please find attached a digital flyer about some online sessions for parents, carers and youth workers about preventing radicalisation and extremism.

These sessions will assist in raising awareness about young people who are susceptible to online radicalisation and extremism. The sessions will be run by a reformed Extreme Right-Wing (ERW) activist who now supports people to leave extremism and helps them build resilience for the future.



Attendees will be given information about where to go for help if they are worried about a family member or other young person they know.

Anyone can be vulnerable to radicalisation, regardless of gender, ethnicity, religion, education or age but some factors can make a person more at risk of being targeted by people with extreme views. With young people having access to the online world at an increasingly earlier age, it is really important that we are all aware of the signs of radicalisation, how it happens and where to go for help.
